Monday Keynote Speaker: Jeffrey "Skunk" Baxter



Jeffrey Baxter - first known for being the Grammy Award-winning guitarist for The Doobie Brothers and one of the founding members of Steely Dan. Now a consultant to the Department of Defense with a high-level security clearance in the Pentagon, he advises top military and civilian groups on asymmetrical warfare, next-generation technologies and unconventional strategies.

"My approach has been to look at existing technologies and try to envision other ways they can be applied, which happens in music all the time and happens to be what terrorists are incredibly good at, as well."

Having the ability to improvise in your thinking is essential to finding answers to the unconventional crises of today. In this way, his thought process is akin to jazz, where one must think on their feet and operate in a non-linear, real-time environment consisting of rhythms, lyrics, chords, melodies and human interaction.

Blockchain Beyond Bitcoin: Use Cases for C-Stores, Wednesday May 2 at 10:15 AM

David Ezell was born in Alabama, and grew up in Atlanta. A music major in college, David discovered computer programming in the early 1980s. Micro-processors were just appearing in cash register devices at that time, and David went to work for a couple of startup companies that specialized in supplying these kinds of systems. He moved on to Bennett Pump Company – a full petroleum emersion – and subsequently went to work for one of his customers, SuperAmerica. He joined Verifone in 1998, moved to Florida, and joined the Petro Team in Clearwater, working as a software design architect on petroleum products. Within one month of starting at Verifone, he found himself in a NACS Technology Standards meeting. He’s been involved with Petroleum Standards ever since: joining POS/Back Office and later serving as chair, and also working in standards advocacy at W3C (representing NACS, chairing the XML Schema Working Group and the Web Payments Interest Group) and more recently at X9/ISO working on Card Technology.




